At **SouJava**, we believe that an open and community-driven JCP benefits everyone. We want **developers**, **Java User Groups** (**JUGs**), and **companies** everywhere to have simple, clear ways to get involved and influence the future of Java. That is why SouJava, the **Java Users Society**, has been committed to the JCP since becoming the **first JUG to join the program**.

#### Who we are

SouJava was **founded in 1998**, the very same year the **JCP was created**. For **nearly 30 years**, both SouJava and the JCP have grown side by side, committed to the evolution of Java and its community. From the very beginning, SouJava's **founding documents defined the group's mission as supporting Java standards**, a commitment we have carried forward ever since.

Based in São Paulo, Brazil's main technology hub, SouJava is one of the largest and most active Java User Groups in the world, with more than 40,000 members. We have hosted activities in dozens of Brazilian cities and supported countless initiatives around education, open source, and developer empowerment. From the start, our mission has been to support developers, promote Java, and make sure the community always has a voice.

### Our work in the JCP

SouJava has been a member of the **JCP Executive Committee for more than a decade**. During this time, we have:

- Promoted openness and transparency in the process.
- Ensured developers, JUGs, and companies can easily participate in and

benefit from the evolution of Java.

- Supported the Java in Education initiative to inspire and prepare the next generation of developers.
- Helped open-source projects contribute to and implement Java standards.
- Supported and defended the importance of an open, standard-compliant
   Java implementation through the OpenJDK project.
- Defended the usage of Java standards by governments and other standards organizations, and worked heavily to get the Brazilian Government to participate and recognize the importance of the JCP, adding open source, standards, and Java to its national technology agenda.
- Championed JUG and developer involvement through the Adopt a JSR program, enabling communities around the world to engage directly with specifications.
- Expanded collaboration with international JUGs, strengthening the worldwide JUG community voice in the JCP.
- Actively contributed to discussions around cloud-native Java, Jakarta EE, and MicroProfile, ensuring these remain open, practical, and community-driven.

## **Recent highlights**

Since the last election cycle, SouJava has:

 Run JUG tours across Europe, North America, and South America, meeting developers, visiting JUGs, and spreading the word about Java, the JCP, and community participation.

- Helped local JUGs restart their activities after the pandemic, bringing developers back together in person.
- Visited universities and technical schools to present the latest in Java and share the importance of standards, open source, and the JCP.
- Created educational content about the JCP, helping developers understand why it matters, how to join, and how it connects with open source and the OpenJDK.

#### **Our commitment**

For **nearly 30 years**, SouJava and the JCP have shared the same journey: keeping **Java strong**, **open**, **and community-driven**. We will continue to:

- Defend openness, balance, and broad community involvement.
- Promote **active participation** from JUGs, students, and professionals around the world.
