PMO Report

The PMO presented general information and statistics to the EC Members about the health of the JCP. The responsibility for the statistics has been passed to Liz Kiener of the PMO, and she has begun providing the EC Members with more information about up coming JSRs and up coming stage changes. This extra information was appreciated by the EC Members.

JCP 2.6 One Year Anniversary

In March of 2004, the PMO, after working with the ECs, launched version 2.6 of the JCP process. This update brought new rules to ensure transparency, encourage more efficient JSRs, and increase participation at all levels. To celebrate the one year anniversary, the PMO is conducting press interviews and reaching out to spread the word about the success of JCP 2.6.

Individuals and the JSPA Update

At a previous meeting, the ECs agreed to do a Maintenance Review on JSR 99 (the JSPA) to make it easier to read and submit. That review period ends on March 28 (next week) and the PMO will begin using that version of the JSPA (version 2.0.1) as the default JSPA soon after that. Also, as agreed to at a previous meeting, the PMO will stop offering the IEPA as an alternative for individual participation. From now on, individuals will be required to sign the JSPA and join as full members.

The PMO is also working to provide the ECs with more legal perspective on the issues that were discussed at the last meeting regarding individuals as members. The PMO expects to have that legal perspective for the next meeting in April.
