JSR 306

Mike DeNicola gave a summary of the two ad hoc conference calls since the October EC meeting.

The meeting discussed the sunset rule. This would set a certain time limit by which a JSR should have progressed to Early Draft Review. The meeting also discussed what, if anything, the process document should say about the role and existence of the expert group when a JSR has finished.

When so requested the PMO repeated its statement from the October meeting that it was not able to incorporate the suggested text related to the Intel motions into the main JSPA draft at this moment.
